European Union - policy context

- ▶ 98.8% enterprises in the European Union are micro and small (1-49 workers)
- Nearly 50% of workforce
- ➤ EU Strategic Framework on Health and Safety at Work 2014-2020
- Safer and Healthier Work for All Modernisation of the EU Occupational Safety and Health Legislation Policy (2017)

Top Three Occupational Safety and Health Actions

- 1) Stepping up the fight against occupational cancer through legislative proposals accompanied by increased guidance and awareness-raising;
- 2) Helping businesses, in particular micro-enterprises and SMEs, comply with occupational safety and health rules;
- 3) Cooperating with Member States and social partners to remove or update outdated rules and to refocus efforts on ensuring better and broader protection, compliance and enforcement on the ground.



Third European Survey of Enterprises on New and Emerging Risks (ESENER-3)

- Fieldwork: April August 2019.
- Mode: computer-assisted telephone interview (CATI).
- Countries: 33.
- Establishments surveyed: 45,420.
- Business size: from 5 employees on.
- Activity sector: all public and private, including agriculture.
- Respondent: person 'who knows best' about safety and health in their establishment
- Topics: OSH management, psychosocial risks, worker representation, drivers and barriers to OSH
- Comparability with ESENER-2!



by size, 2019 (% establishments, EU27_2020)



by size, 2019 (% establishments, EU27_2020)



by size, 2019 (% establishments, EU27_2020)




Base: establishments in the EU27_2020 that do not carry out risk assessments regularly.

(% establishments, EU27_2020)



ESENER-3: No risk factors present in the establishment


by size 2019 (% establishments, EU27_2020)

Improving OSH in micro and small enterprises (EU-OSHA, 2014-18)



> Aims

- Evidence-based support for policy recommendations
- Good practices in terms of policies, strategies and interventions
- Research methods: desk research and field analyses
- Contractor: Belgium (Katholieke Universiteit Leuven), Denmark (Aalborg University), Estonia (Tallinn University of Technology), France (Institut Polytechnique de Bordeaux), Germany (Kooperationsstelle), Italy (Politecnico di Milano), Romania (INCDPM), Sweden (IVL Svenska Mijoeinstitutet), United Kingdom (Cardiff University)



Phase 1: The strategy dilemma

✓ 'General and multifaceted lack of resources'. A substantial proportion of MSEs are those pursuing 'low road survival strategies'

The high road

- Searching and finding niche markets
- Developing a stable customer base
- Maintaining a committed and loyal staff
- Adjusting to new conditions with agility





The low road

- Working long hours
- Keeping costs down
- Agreeing to still poorer sales conditions
- Squeezing employee conditions
- Accepting low personal income

Most small firms caught between both



Phase 2: Interviews with MSEs (160 case studies)

Different needs and motivation:

Avoiders

'Accidents are stupid coincidences which are very difficult to foresee'

'Musculoskeletal problems? Well, we all get worn down one day...'

Reactors

'Risk assessment is not what we really like doing in our jobs, but it has to be done'

Learners

'I know the knowledge is out there, I just have to find it'

'Risk Assessment is a living document, when a new risk is identified, we add it there'



Phase 2: Interviews with MSEs (160 case studies)

Common and shared perspective (managers and workers)

- Reactive approach and ad hoc actions
- Strong believe in 'common sense'
- Social and spatial proximity, easy to normalize unsafe acts
- Risks perceived as 'part of the job', health risks underestimated
- Believe in individual responsibility for OSH





Phase 3: OSH policies, strategies, interventions and existing support

- Good practices examples
- Actions by Authorities (Inspection Campaign, Denmark)
- E-tools for risk assessment (OiRA, EU-OSHA; Stress Management, Italy)
- Sectoral Programs (Agriculture Advisors, Estonia; BAMBUS, Denmark)
- Training traditional and online (Synergy, France; Safe in the store, Sweden)
- Inspections by other bodies (General Pharmaceutical Council, UK)





Phase 3: OSH policies, strategies, interventions and existing support

Success factors

- Recommendation by authorities, endorsed by the social partners
- Direct, face-to-face interaction
- Solutions to concrete problems
- Adapted to the needs and conditions in the MSE
- Simple, free of charge, no 'risk' of being inspected when using a tool

"You need to show genuine interest in their business and their needs"





Phase 4: Final Analysis

- ➤ Improving OSH in micro and small enterprises is possible a wide range of tools and interventions exists
- However, there is a need for solutions which are effective in reaching out to the most vulnerable MSEs
- ➤ What works, for whom and under what circumstances? What is the role of:
 - Governance, regulation and enforcement
 - Social partners
 - Advisory services
 - Education and practical support
