Safety at work in the lift sector

Highlights of the event

Brussels, December 7th, 2020

The last 2020 SBS event organised by EFESME was the SBS Lift Forum dedicated to **safety at work, and to European and national policies in this field**, which took place online on 3rd December.

The topic, always of crucial importance for all companies, became even more so during the Covid-19 emergency. EFESME and SBS therefore decided to study the topic, and to present different points of view and considerations on the subject: what are the **European policies on safety at work**, and **how do they involve SMEs**? What is the **national approach on the subject**, and **how do lift SMEs react to it**? And what is the **role of standards** in all this?

After the opening speeches by **Mr. Massimo Bezzi, President of <u>EFESME</u>**, and **Ms. Gunilla Almgren, President of <u>SBS – Small Business Standards</u></u>, on the importance of safety at work** for SMEs and to **role of standardisation in it**, the event moved to its first panel, dedicated to EU policies.

The speakers were Mr. **Matthias Fritz, from <u>EC DG-EMPL</u>**, and **Mr. Cockburn, from** <u>**EU-OSHA**</u>. Both spoke about **EU policies and studies on safety at work**, and about the several initiatives to involve SMEs to guarantee a safe place where to work.
